An Economist's View On How Bavarian Business Practices Nurture BMW Sales


When it comes to shocking news Bayerische Motoren Werke rarely makes waves. The Bavarian ultimate driving machine surprises no one due to its solid performance year after year. Both drivers as well as stockholders almost expect it to do well time and time again. However this high degree of success can be traced back to a set of successful policy implementations that collectively achieved some splendid results. As an economist I deal with numbers and figures on the one hand and policy practices on the other, and today I would like to share some of that with you. Let's see how BMW achieved its staggering success, by taking a quick look at some of the numbers released by the company.

In the last quarter of 2018 well over half a million BMW Group cars sold across the globe (including Mini and RR). This has closely matched previous year's performance (see chart comparison), which consequently places the company among the most profitable of firms practicing the sustainable leadership mantra (bar chart by BMW financial).

BMW has been one of the top implementers of what are collectively called sustainable leadership practices. Chief among these are a model of holistic management that cares for three major stakeholders, viz, the people who work on and use the automobiles, the shareholders whose investment depends on a profitable return, and perhaps more importantly the environment. BMW focuses on pursuing all three pillars and not to neglect one in favor of another. To achieve this they keenly pursue performance outcomes and key performance drivers informed by their base practices in the company. In some circles they call this corporate social responsibility and the Bavarian automaker is no stranger to the topic. In fact it is this long-term view of social responsibility that informs BMW best business practices to be a responsible leader in the automotive industry.

In terms of the shareholders BMW like many other companies witnessed a difficult quarter in the back and forth trade wars and tariffs between China and the United States. Although the impact from these retaliatory tariffs have been minimal on the German automaker so far, we can see a slight drop in the BMW stock that closely tracks the downward move of the German financial index, the DAX, as seen in the graph. So as shown in the comparison 1-year graph, the trade disputes among two of the globes' largest economies that dominated the second quarter of this year, also had a dampening affect on the BMW stock. Even so the demand for automobiles continued to grow this year. While California's demand for BMWs has long been among the largest regional markets in the world, China remains among the top for total BMW sales. In fact we can see that China just slightly outpaces the US followed by a wider margin, by Germany, the UK and others in this 2015 BMW Sales Chart by Country (Pie chart graph showing sales % by Nazgol Makki):

The strong sales at BMW due to its exceptional sustainable leadership business practices are nothing new. In fact just a few years back in 2014 BMW announced that it had set the top sales records among German luxury automakers. It posted that its sales records for 2013 tops that of luxury carmaker rivals Audi and Mercedes Benz, allowing it to keep its No. 1 spot as it did in the year prior to that. The Bavarian marquee had sold 1.66 million BMWs that year, a near 8% increase over the previous year's numbers. As we have seen by the numbers, sustainable business practices have in the past and will continue into the future to help BMW succeed and remain a market leader in the automotive industry.
